Prospect High School was established in January 1969 and is part of the Prospect Alternative Center for Education (P.A.C.E.) Included under the P.A.C.E. umbrella is the continuation program, a daycare center, a teen parenting program, In-School Suspension, and the Oroville Community Day School.

Prospect High School Basics



Finding Success at PHS is as easy as A-B-C:

A- Attendance: Students need to be at school regularly to be able to earn credits. We have a 6 period day that goes from 8:10AM-2:55PM. Classes are scheduled in 12 week trimester and students receives a report card every 6 weeks.

B- Behavior: Students can earn detentions and suspensions for violation of the CA Education Code. Detention must be served within a week of earning it. We do not have a 9-step program at Prospect.

C-Credits: Students can earn up to 2.5 credits in each class per 6 week block. Students earn *variable credit* which means credit earned by how much work is completed and how well it is done. A student earning 12.5 credits in a block earns a PHS T-shirt for being on Honor Roll.

Jump Start Class- required for all new students.

Jump Start is a course designed to further student knowledge about Prospect High School and prepare students for success in this program. It will cover Prospect's culture, services, procedures, handouts, publications and campus layout. Students will be required to complete a number of activities and assignments that will require them to analyze educational options and formulate an academic plan. Students will develop strategies and goals to ensure their experience at Prospect High School is a successful one. Credits for this class count towards the Health requirement for graduation.

Transferring Credit- Students are awarded pro-rated credit for any passing grade depending on the time of year they enroll. Students do not lose any credit when transferring into our program.
